


Arrowhead High School conducted a community-wide survey in spring 2024 to gather input on the school's operational and facilities plans. The community's input will help guide our next steps, including potential November 2024 referendum questions.

Thank you to the parents, staff, and community members who completed our survey. Your feedback will help us develop a plan that meets our students' needs and is consistent with community values.

This flyer presents survey results weighted to reflect our community's makeup. Parents make up 30% of the population, so their responses are weighted accordingly. Non-parents comprise the remaining 70%, and their responses are weighted to reflect that proportion.

residents responded to our planning survey.




Respondents with children in the District.

70.6% support a 4-year, \$1.9 million operating referendum




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
State funding has not kept up with inflation and increasing costs for transportation, utilities, staff compensation, insurance, and services for students in special education. This operating referendum helps account for this deficit.

## Our community supports consolidating to a single high school building.

Currently, we operate North and South campus buildings.

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
### 3 Our community's support is similar for all building consolidation options.

Build all new facilities at one time \$261.2M option (Includes a pool and auditorium)

**Build a new high school** \$214.5M option

Renovate/expand an existing school \$172.2M option

**Renovate both buildings** \$153.2M option

If approved by voters, the new school would be built on the existing AHS site. New construction minimizes disruption to teaching and learning compared to the significant disruptions caused by renovating an existing school.

#### Did you know?


The current auditorium holds only 439 spectators despite each grade level exceeding 500 students.

If the current pool breaks, the school board has decided not to spend more than \$100,000 to make repairs. When this happens, the pool would be closed.
